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About Us

Marshall Area EMS is housed in the public safety building, along with the Marshall Fire Department on Industrial Drive in Marshall, WI.

Our department consists of around 45 members and a full-time director. All of the members are trained emergency medical technicians of all levels. Marshall EMS is a licensed Advanced EMT service.

Marshall EMS is a paid on-call service. Members can schedule their call time at times that are convenient for them, but are still required to meet the minimum call hours every month.

Membership

The department accepts applications from adults regardless of gender, race, religious or sexual preference. Applicants must be at least 18 years of age, have a valid driver's license, and pass a criminal background check. Applicants desiring to be EMTs should be able to handle the physical requirements and demands of the job. Applications are available in-person or can be e-mailed to you upon request.

If your application is reviewed and you are a possible candidate for a position on Marshall EMS, you will be contacted by the director for an interview.

If you are selected for a position, you will be brought on as a probationary member. Requirements to complete your probation will be explained to you in orientation, but include required trainings.

If you are not a trained EMT, don't hesitate to apply anyway. There are opportunities to be sponsored through an EMT-Basic class.

Classes are held at MATC and the college offers a variety of different class times.

Every member is required to take at least 36 hours a month in call time. Members are allowed to sign up for additional call shifts if their schedules permit.

Monthly Meetings

Members are required to attend monthly training meetings that are held on the second Monday of every month. The trainings start at 6:30 pm and last two to three hours. There is also an online component including a video and quiz that must be completed for those who are unable to attend the in-person meeting. 100% compliance is mandatory.

During these meetings, we discuss Marshall EMS protocols and equipment usage. Guest speakers also help us utilize the tools we have to become better EMTs.

Committees and Community Events

Every year, members are required to take part in the committees that we have established. We strive to make our presence known in the community and want people to know that Marshall EMS is there for them.
